Diary of an Unborn Baby



Day 1 Fertilization: all human chromosomes are present, and a unique life beings.

Day 6 The embryo begins implanting in the uterus.

Day 22 The heart begins to beat with the child's own blood, often with a different blood type than the mother's.

Week 5 Eyes, legs, and hands begin to develop.

Week 6 Brain waves are detectable¹. The mouth and lips are present, and fingers are forming².



Week 7 Eyelids and toes form. The baby now has a distinct nose and is kicking and swimming³.

Week 8 Every organ is in place⁴; bones⁵, fingerprints² begin to form.



Weeks 9 & 10 Teeth begin to form, fingernails develop⁵; baby can turn head⁵ and frown².

Week 11 Baby can grasp object placed in hand³.

Week 17 Baby can have dream (REM) sleep⁷.

MORE THAN NUMBERS

There have been **more than 57 million abortions** in the U.S. since 1973.

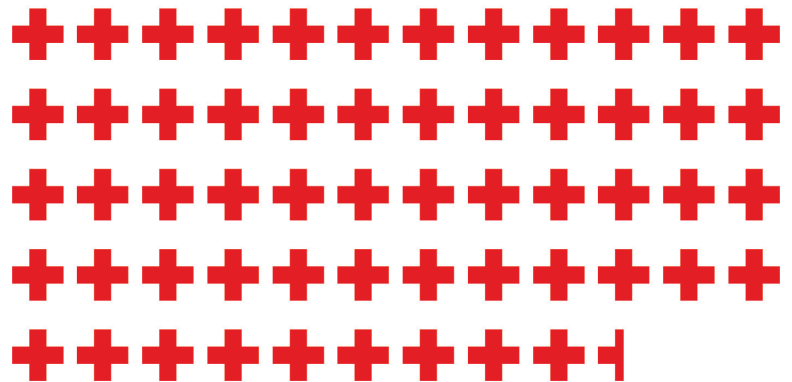
There were over **1,058,000 abortions** in 2011. That is nearly **2,900 abortions per day, 120 per hour, 1 every 30 seconds.**

Of all pregnancies that resulted in either live birth or abortion in 2011, **21.2% resulted in abortion.**

Abortions in the U.S. Since 1973:

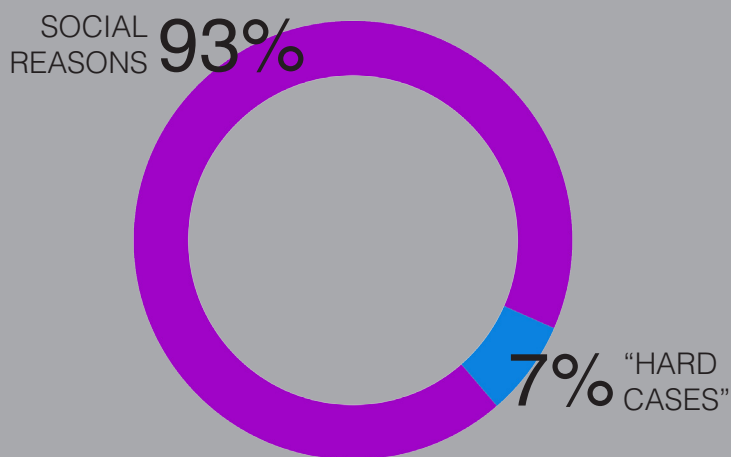


American Casualties from every war since 1775:

Social Reasons (given as primary reason)

•Feels unready for child/responsibility	25%
•Feels she can't afford baby	23%
•Has all children she wants	19%
other family responsibility	19%
•Relationship problems/single motherhood	8%
•Feels she isn't mature enough	7%
•Interference with education/career plans	4%
•Parents/partner wants abortion	>1%
•Other reasons	>6.5%
TOTAL	approx. 93%

"Hard Cases" (given as primary reason)

•Mother's health	4%
•Baby may have health problem	3%
•Rape	<0.5%
TOTAL	approx. 7%

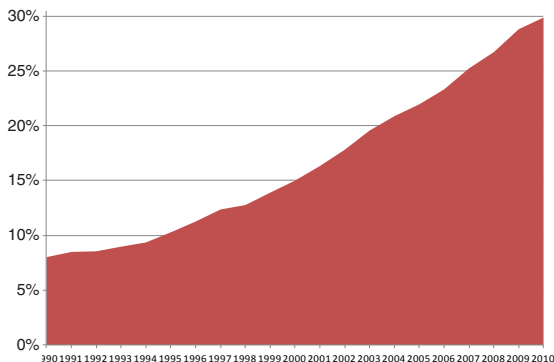


A November 2014 poll by The Polling Company™ found that only **13%** of Americans held the position that abortion should be legal for any reason and essentially at any time during pregnancy, the doctrine of the Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision.

ABORTION AS BIG BUSINESS

Using the average cost of \$451 per abortion, **the abortion business is at least a \$477 million a year industry.**

Although abortions in the U.S. have declined since 1990, the percentage of abortions for which Planned Parenthood is responsible has steadily increased from 8% in 1990 to more than 30% today. **Planned Parenthood is now responsible for nearly 1/3 of all abortions in the U.S.**

HOW THINGS HAVE CHANGED

Planned Parenthood in 1963:

"An abortion kills the life of the baby after it has begun."

Planned Parenthood Today:

While dropping in the U.S. as a whole, abortions performed at PPFA clinics during the same time frame (1990-2010) have increased by **255%**.
